ZIMBABWE PART OF THE CIRCULAR ECONOMY STUDY BEING FUNDED BY THE EU

I hope that I find you well and that you are working hard to make your companies prosper and thus contributing to the development of critical infrastructure in Zimbabwe.

I am pleased to inform you that ZBCA in partnership with the Construction Industry Federation of Namibia (CIF) and Botswana Business submitted a request to Africa RISE (Reform for Investment and Sustainable Economies) to assist with the appointment of a consultant to help the Built Environment in Zimbabwe unpack the circular economy (Green Building). In return Africa Rise through the Switch to Green facility successfully approached the European Union (EU) for funding. The project will kick off next week on Thursday the 16th of March 2023, with the first meeting where the following issues will be discussed:

- a) Awareness raising for Circular Economy opportunities recycle and reuse;
- b) Economic benefits and significance of waste as a resource;
- c) Proposed models that can be used by the construction industry; and
- d) Waste transfer technologies and on-source separation techniques.

This Switch to Green facility aims to deliver a set of tools and services which support the overall coherence, coordination, effectiveness impact and visibility of EU international partnership in the green.

Phase I involves workshops with the private sector to impart circularity knowledge and circular economy (CE) concepts.

Phase II will start with the development and agreement on an action plan with interested stakeholders in the private sector and government to test some of the circularity models.

This is an opportunity that should not be missed. We, therefore, call on members to participate fully in this program that seeks to enhance effective resource utilization.
